COLOMBIAN ADOPTION PROGRAM

The children in need of adoption from Colombia are generally healthy infants, toddlers, and children up to age 16. Many older children, sibling groups and special needs children are also available. Children may have been relinquished at birth in the hospital, abandoned, or taken into protection. Most children are waiting in one of several orphanages in Colombia, though some children are placed in foster care. The length of time you will wait for a child's referral, following LSSMN approval, will depend upon the age of the child requested. Families applying through a private orphanage may wait 3-24 months for a referral. Families applying through the government program – Instituto Colombiano de Bienestar Familiar (ICBF) – may wait 3-36 months or more for a referral. Typically the younger the child, the longer the wait for a referral. You may expect to travel to Colombia approximately 4-6 weeks after receiving and accepting your referral. Referral times vary between programs.

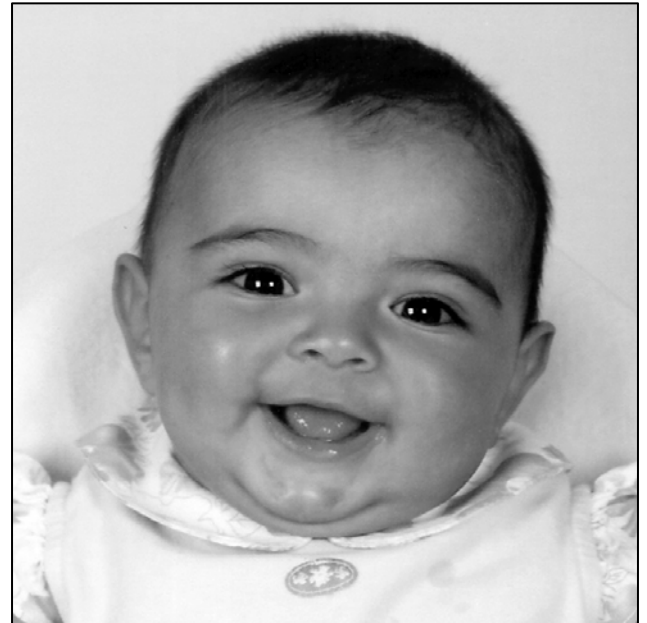

PROGRAM AT-A-GLANCE

AGE REQUIREMENTS: Families must be open to children of either gender within the following age ranges (or older):

Parents 25-38 yrs old

One child 0-35 months or two siblings 0-59 months;

Parents 39-41 yrs old

One child 36-59 months or two siblings 0-60 months;

Parents 42-44 yrs old

One child 60-83 months or 2 siblings 0-83 months;

Parents 45-47 yrs old

One child 84-107 months or two siblings 0-107 months;

Parents 48+ yrs old

One child 108+ months or two siblings 0-108 months.

LENGTH OF MARRIAGE: 1 year minimum

CHILDREN IN FAMILY: families open to children 3 or younger must have no more than 1-2 children in the home; larger families welcome for special needs and waiting children of any age

SINGLE APPLICANT: Single men and women accepted for children age 8 and older or for children with special needs

TRAVEL: One trip, approximately 5-8 weeks; both parents expected to travel; one parent may depart after 2 weeks, if necessary

TIMELINE: Varies; dossier to referral 6-36 months; travel generally 4-6 weeks after accepting referral
