## WAITING CHILD PROGRAM

### COLOMBIA WAITING CHILD PROGRAM

The children who wait in Colombia for families may be waiting solely due to their age or because they are part of a large sibling group. Some children wait due to correctable medical issues or issues that may affect the child/ren for their lifetime. The waiting children most in need of families include:

- Single child of any age with mild or correctable medical special needs (i.e. scoliosis, cleft lip/palate, orthopedic issues)
- Single child of any age with moderate or severe special needs (i.e. HIV, Down Syndrome, neurological delays, Cerebral Palsy, Syphilis)
- Single child 7 years old or older
- Sibling groups of 2 or more in which at least one child is more than 8 years of age
- Sibling groups of 3 or more children (all ages)
- Sibling groups in which at least one child has special needs

Children are generally cared for in an orphanage or foster care family. Children may have been relinquished at birth or later in life or may have been taken under protection by the Colombian Child Welfare Institute (ICBF) due to abuse or neglect in their birth families. Because there are more than 8,000 children awaiting their forever families in Colombia, families open to waiting children will be given administrative priority in Colombia in order to unite the children with their families as soon as possible.

LSSMN has a list of waiting children – though this does not include all children waiting for families from Colombia. Once you have been matched with a child, your dossier will be sent to the institution in charge of his/her care for final approval. Typically, families may expect to travel to Colombia approximately 4-6 weeks after receiving and accepting a referral.

LSSMN also provides humanitarian aid to both private and public organizations to support the care of children under state protection, provide medical care for special needs children and rehabilitation programs for vulnerable families, and support requests for the individual needs of children and the organizations who support them. We strive to assist well-established organizations affecting change in the lives of vulnerable women, children, and families.

### PROGRAM AT-A-GLANCE

**AGE REQUIREMENTS:** Families must be open to children of either gender within the following age ranges (or older):

**Parents 25-38 yrs old**

One child 0-35 months or two siblings 0-59 months;

**Parents 39-41 yrs old**

One child 36-59 months or two siblings 0-60 months;

**Parents 42-44 yrs old**

One child 60-83 months or 2 siblings 0-83 months;

**Parents 45-47 yrs old**

One child 84-107 months or two siblings 0-107 months;

**Parents 48+ yrs old**

One child 108+ months or two siblings 0-108 months.

**LENGTH OF MARRIAGE:** 1 year minimum

**CHILDREN IN FAMILY:** families open to children 3 or younger must have no more than 1-2 children in the home; larger families welcome for special needs and waiting children of any age

**SINGLE APPLICANT:** Single men and women accepted for children age 8 and older or for children with special needs

**TRAVEL:** One trip, approximately 5-8 weeks; both parents expected to travel; one parent may depart after 2 weeks, if necessary

**TIMELINE:** Varies; dossier to referral 2-6 months (when child/ren not previously identified); travel generally 4-6 weeks after accepting referral
