Camper Stats:



100% of campers had fun at Camp Noah.

96% of campers **learned** that they were **somebody special**.

93% indicated that they were prepared for stormy weather.

97% know their safe place and can go there when they feel anxious or afraid.

100% of parents would recommend Camp Noah to other parents.





What Parents Observed After Camp Ended

After attending Camp Noah, parents reported that their child(ren) could stay calm and safe during severe weather (95% of parents indicated that their child(ren) know their safe place and can go there when they feel anxious or afraid), better cope with their emotions (88% of parents indicated that their child(ren) learned ways to relax) and feel more prepared for storms (89% learned how to stay safe during stormy weather).

According to one parent, "He was able to learn ways that help him realize he can stay calm and safe in severe weather, as well as learning more about ways to talk through any negative thoughts and feelings".

Camper and Volunteer Numbers:

208 campers participated in Camp Noah curriculum and were supported by a total of 124 volunteers.
