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He was lucky to find a safe place to stay through LSS of Minnesota's Another Door emergency shelter in Duluth. He also learned important life skills through the LSS Oh No! Eighteen program that helped him find a job and become independent. He graduated from high school in June, lives on his own in an apartment and finds fulfillment working on the maintenance crew for the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center.

"LSS is one of the best things that could have happened to me," he said. "My wings are about 15 feet long now and I can fly like the wind."
