

Domain Comparison Summary

For 4 <u>y.o.'s</u> on average in 2022-23, we see fairly low gain across domains, with no gain in Language and Literacy and loss of measured competence in Mathematical Thinking. Children are moving toward proficient competence, but in smaller steps.

It is worth noting the variability of time within the preschool, as some children only entered the preschool in the at age 4 and did not have the 3yo experience here.
